## We welcome you today

#### We would like to remind our visitors of the following;:

- All people are encouraged to participate in the sacred services of our Church. We hope that you will be able to worship as well as have fellowship with us. Should you wish any information about the Orthodox Faith or this parish in particular, please see the rector or any member of the church. We are able to place you on our mailing list.
- Only Orthodox Christians may receive the Eucharist (Holy Communion) in the Orthodox Church. In like manner, Orthodox Christians may not receive the sacraments in an non-Orthodox Church. While we hope that one day all Christians will find unity and be able to approach the chalice of our Lord together, we observe the teachings of the Church that the Eucharist is a gift of unity and not a means of unity.

#### We remind our faithful and visitors of the following guidelines concerning the Holy Sacraments in the Orthodox Church.

- Orthodox Christians are urged to receive Holy Communion frequently.
- Communicants should be at peace with others before approaching the chalice(Mt 5:23-24)
- Realize the importance of making a thorough examination of sins and transgressions against God, ourselves and others and having prayed for forgiveness before coming to Holy Communion.
- Frequent communicants should come to Holy Confession at least four times a year (during the four fasting periods of the year). and additionally when an examination of conscience reveals the necessity to do so in order to heal any sinful behavior.
- Communicants should fast from all foods and liquids from the evening before receiving Holy Communion.
- Communicants should read prayers in preparation for receiving Holy Communion.
- All Orthodox Christians must receive the sacraments at least once a year.
- Those who are late for Divine Liturgy (after the reading of the Epistle and Gospel) should not approach the chalice.
- Those who are ill or who have special physical needs are exempt from the above guidelines.
- Infants and children (up to the age of seven) who are Orthodox Christians may receive Holy Communion and are exempt from the above guidelines.

Thank you for gathering to worship with us today. Together we have glorified the One God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. May we be brought closer to one another and closer to God by following the eternal teachings of our Lord.

**ті**, хто причащаються, повинні бути у мирі з іншими перш, нас підійти до євхаристичної чаші (Св.Матвій 5:23-24); **перед** тим, як прийти на Святе Причастя, дуже важливо ретельно осмислити гріхи і порушення, які було вчинено проти Бога, нас самих та інших і помолитися за їх відпущення;

**тим**, хто часто причащається, слід приходити на святу сповідь принаймні чотири рази на рік (під час кожного із чотирьох щорічних постів);

**ті,** хто причащається, повинні з вечора перед прийняттям Святого Причастя, припинити вживання всякої їжі і напоїв; **ті,** хто причащається, повинні шляхом молитов підготувати себе до прийняття причастя;

Then he put him on his mule, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. Next morning he took out a couple of shillings, gave them to the innkeeper, and said to him: 'Take care of him, and whatever you spend besides, I will refund you on my way back."

"Now which one of these three proved himself a neighbor to the man who fell among the robbers?" The lawyer answered: "The man who showed mercy on him."

Then Jesus said to him: "Go and do likewise."

**FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS:** At the annual parish meeting held on Sunday, October 29, 2023, the parish voted to increase the base annual member obligation from \$600 to \$725 per member, effective beginning with the 2024 calendar year. Any member who is unable to meet the financial obligations may request a hardship exemption. Exemption requests should be made in writing to the Parish Council.

**BASKET DONATIONS:** Just a reminder that the initial basket collection is generally for member obligations. Member obligations go toward the "General Fund" which pays the operating expenses of the church and church properties. Any loose donations in the first collection also go toward the General Fund. The second collection each Sunday goes toward Sunday School expenses. The third collection at the end of Liturgy at the dismissal is your gift to the Priest.

<u>CHRISTMAS AT THE SEMINARY</u>: Our annual "Christmas at the Seminary" coffee hour will be held this year on Sunday December 10th. We are again asking for donations to support our Seminarians. 
We ended up serving between 375 and 400 meals. That consisted of 250+ take-out orders and over 125+ eat-in and pickup orders. We cooked over 300 lbs. of Turkey and ran out again. One of the issues we had with the 300 lbs. of Turkey was that we had too many smaller birds. We also had 70 lbs. of Ham. In past years we never had enough

Ham, this year we had Ham leftovers. We had lots of pies and we had leftover pies. Natalie Turicik did a great job getting people to donate pies.

Again our parishioners and people from the community helped with food and monetary donations that made this possible. The best example of the community helping with donations this year is Honus Wagner, we delivered 80 meals to them and they gave us 4 Turkeys.

And finally, the number of people who donated their time and helped Tuesday through Friday was unbelievable.

I would like to Thank Everyone who helped with this year's Thanksgiving Dinner, your donations of food products, monetary donations, and donations of your time helped make this a success.




We also had a very nice article from the Post Gazette on our efforts to provide meals to the people in our community. The link below will take you to the article.






