We would like to remind our visitors of the following;:

- All people are encouraged to participate in the sacred services of our Church. We hope that you will be able to worship as well as have fellowship with us. Should you wish any information about the Orthodox Faith or this parish in particular, please see the rector or any member of the church. We are able to place you on our mailing list.
- Only Orthodox Christians may receive the Eucharist (Holy Communion) in the Orthodox Church. In like manner, Orthodox Christians may not receive the sacraments in an non-Orthodox Church. While we hope that one day all Christians will find unity and be able to approach the chalice of our Lord together, we observe the teachings of the Church that the Eucharist is a gift of unity and not a means of unity.

We remind our faithful and visitors of the following guidelines concerning the Holy Sacraments in the Orthodox Church.

- Orthodox Christians are urged to receive Holy Communion frequently.
- ❖ Communicants should be at peace with others before approaching the chalice(Mt 5:23-24)
- Realize the importance of making a thorough examination of sins and transgressions against God, ourselves and others and having prayed for forgiveness before coming to Holy Communion.
- Frequent communicants should come to Holy Confession at least four times a year (during the four fasting periods of the year). and additionally when an examination of conscience reveals the necessity to do so in order to heal any sinful behavior.
- Communicants should fast from all foods and liquids from the evening before receiving Holy Communion.
- Communicants should read prayers in preparation for receiving Holy Communion.
- All Orthodox Christians must receive the sacraments at least once a year.
- Those who are late for Divine Liturgy (after the reading of the Epistle and Gospel) should not approach the chalice.
- Those who are ill or who have special physical needs are exempt from the above guidelines.
- Infants and children (up to the age of seven) who are Orthodox Christians may receive Holy Communion and are exempt from the above guidelines.

Thank you for gathering to worship with us today. Together we have glorified the One God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. May we be brought closer to one another and closer to God by following the eternal teachings of our Lord.

ми спонукаємо православних християн часто ходити до Святого Причастя;

ті, хто причащаються, повинні бути у мирі з іншими перш, нас підійти до євхаристичної чаші (Св.Матвій 5:23-24); **перед** тим, як прийти на Святе Причастя, дуже важливо ретельно осмислити гріхи і порушення, які було вчинено проти Бога, нас самих та інших і помолитися за їх відпущення;

тим, хто часто причащається, слід приходити на святу сповідь принаймні чотири рази на рік (під час кожного із чотирьох щорічних постів);

ті, хто причащається, повинні з вечора перед прийняттям Святого Причастя, припинити вживання всякої їжі і напоїв; **ті,** хто причащається, повинні шляхом молитов підготувати себе до прийняття причастя;

всі православні християни повинні, принаймні, раз на рік отримати Святе Причастя;

ті, хто спізнився на Божественну Літургію (прийшов після того, як було прочитано Апостол і Євангеліє) не можуть підходити до чаші; **хворі**, і ті, хто має обмезсені фізичні моеисливості, звільняються від вище викладених вимог; **немовлята** та діти до семи років, які належать до Православної християнської віри, можуть отримувати Святе Причастя і звільняються від вшиє викладених вимог;

LESSON FROM THE EPISTLE OF SAINT PAUL TO THE HEBREWS

(c. 9, v. 11-14)

Brethren, Christ appeared as the high priest of the blessings to come through the greater and more perfect tabernacle, which was not built by human hands and did not belong to this creation. He entered the sanctuary once for all, not with the blood of goats and calves, but with his own blood and granted us an eternal redemption.

The Jews believe that the ceremonial sprinkling with the blood of bulls and goats, and with the ashes of a heifer purifies and sanctifies defiled persons. Then, the blood of Christ, who through the Holy Spirit offered himself to God as an immaculate sacrifice, will much more cleanse our conscience than lifeless observances, and enable us to worship the living God.



THE GOSPEL ACCORDING TO SAINT MARK

(c.. 10, v. 32-45)

At that time, Jesus took his twelve Disciples aside and began to explain to them what would befall him: "Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem. There the Messiah will be betrayed into the hands of the high priests and the scribes; they will sentence him to death; they will hand him over to the Gentiles; they will mock him; they will flog him; and they will kill him. But he will rise again on the third day."

Then James and John, the sons of Zebedee, approached him and said: "Master, we want you to do for us whatever we ask." Jesus asked them: "What do you want me to do for you?" They replied: "Grant us that we may sit one at your right and one at your left in the day of your glory." Jesus said to them: "You do not know what you ask. Can you drink the cup that I drink, and be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized?" They answered him: "We can."



Jesus said to them: "Indeed, you will drink the cup that I drink, and you will be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized. But to sit at my right and at my left is not mine to grant, for it belongs to those for whom it has been prepared."

When the other ten Disciples heard this request, they began to be very indignant at James and John. Thereupon Jesus called them and said to them: "You know that those who are supposed to rule over the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great men exercise authority over them. But it must not be so with you. On the contrary, whoever wants to be great among you must be your minister; and whoever wants to be your leader must be the servant of all. For the Messiah has not come to be served but to serve and give his life as a ransom for many."

Від Марка 10:32-45

Сталося це по дорозі до Єрусалиму. Ісус ішов попереду. Його учні були збентежені, а ті, котрі йшли позаду, відчували страх. Знову Ісус відкликав дванадцятьох і почав розповідати їм про те, що має статися з Ним в Єрусалимі: «Ми йдемо до Єрусалиму. Там Сина Людського буде віддано до рук головних священиків та книжників. Вони засудять Його на смерть і віддадуть поганам. Ті збиткуватимуться з Нього, плюватимуть на Нього й битимуть Його батогами, а потім вб'ють. Але через три дні Він воскресне з мертвих».

Яків та Іоан, сини Зеведеєві, підійшли до Ісуса й кажуть: «Учителю, ми хочемо, щоб Ти зробив для нас те, про що ми попросим Тебе». Ісус запитав їх: «Що ж ви бажаєте, щоб Я зробив для вас?» А вони кажуть: «Дозволь нам розділити з Тобою велику Славу Твою: дозволь одному з нас сидіти по праву руку від Тебе, а другому — по ліву». Ісус відповів: «Ви не знаєте, про що просите! Чи зможете ви випити чашу страждань, яку Я випити маю, і прийняти таке хрещення, яке Я приймаю?» Вони відповіли: «Так, ми зможемо». Тоді Ісус сказав їм: «Істинно кажу вам, ви вип'єте з чаші, яку Я питиму, і приймете таке хрещення, яке Я приймаю, але кому сидіти від Мене праворуч чи ліворуч — те не Мені вирішувати. Господь приготував ці місця для обранців Своїх».

Почувши це, інші десять учнів розгнівалися на Якова та Іоана. Тоді Ісус покликав їх до Себе і сказав: «Ви знаєте, що погани обирають правителів, які люблять показувати владу свою над людьми, а їхні намісники гноблять народ. Але ж не так має бути між вами: хто хоче бути великим, хай стане слугою для вас; хто хоче стати першим серед вас, хай буде рабом для всіх. Бо навіть Син Людський прийшов не для того, щоб Йому служили, а щоб Самому служити іншим й віддати життя Своє як викуп за багатьох».



Healing Comes Through Repentance, Not Through Seeking Earthly Glory: Homily for the Fifth Sunday of Great Lent and Commemoration of our Righteous Mother Mary of Egypt in the Orthodox Church

If we want a clear example of the difference between the character of our Lord and that of corrupt humanity, we need look no further than today's gospel lesson. In response to the prediction of His Passion, the disciples James and John asked for an assurance that the Lord would give them privileged places of prominence in His Reign, which they imagined to be an earthly kingdom. "Grant us to sit, one at Your right hand and one at Your left, in Your glory." They had no idea what they were asking, of course, for the path to our Lord's Kingdom is not through self-exaltation according to the



conventional standards of the fallen world, but requires uniting ourselves to Him in His suffering, death, and selfless service by taking up our crosses. "For the Son of man also came not to be served but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many."

To this very day, we often distort faithfulness to Christ into the vain pursuit of earthly glory and self-satisfaction in a fashion that is simply contradictory to the way of our Lord, Who offered up Himself fully on the Cross for the salvation of the world. Contrary to any conventional standard of success, He "made Himself of no reputation,"

taking the form of a bondservant...And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself and became obedient to the point of death, even the death of the cross." (Philippians 2:7-8) His salvation is not an easy continuation of the proud strivings that we are all inclined to pursue in one way or another, but their complete opposite. Only those who know their own brokenness and the inadequacy of even their best efforts to bring healing to their souls will gain the spiritual vision necessary to behold the true glory that shines from His Cross and empty tomb.

On this last Sunday of Great Lent, we commemorate someone who had no illusions about deserving heavenly or earthly glory of any kind. Our Righteous Mother Mary of Egypt had from the age of twelve lived as a sex addict. She had refused money for her innumerable encounters with men and said that she "had an insatiable desire and an irrepressible passion for lying in filth. This was life to me. Every kind of abuse of nature I regarded as life." Though we do not know why she left her parents' home at a young age and fell into such a wretched existence, she may well have been a victim of sexual abuse. She confessed forcing herself on "youths even against their own will" as she sailed to Jerusalem and said that she was actually "hunting for youths" on the streets on the feast of the Exaltation of the Cross when she followed the crowds to the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. Only a horribly wounded and miserable person would live like that.

When an invisible force prevented Mary from entering the Church in order to venerate the Cross, Mary's eyes were opened to her wretchedness and she asked for the help of the Theotokos in finding salvation. Thus began her almost 50 years of intense ascetical struggle in the desert. By the time Father Zosima stumbled upon her, Mary had become so radiant with holiness that she walked on water, rose above the ground in prayer, was clairvoyant, and knew the Scriptures, even though she had never read them. Pride had no place in her soul and she was aware only of her sinfulness and ongoing need for the Lord's mercy. Mary had not found healing through attempts at self-glorification, but by humbly undertaking the incredibly difficult struggles that were necessary for her to receive personally the grace of the Savior.

If we have approached Lent with any degree of spiritual seriousness this year, we should resonate with St. Mary of Egypt as someone who knew that she needed healing infinitely beyond what she could give herself. Lent reveals that we find it impossibly hard to pray without distraction for even a few minutes, to fast even in ways that do not threaten our health at all, and to share with others even when it does not compromise our wellbeing. And that is surely only the tip of the iceberg, for our addiction to self-centered desire roots so deeply within us that it corrupts even our noblest aspirations in life. Insisting on getting what we want from Christ on our own terms, as did James and John, is pure folly and will never heal our souls. Entering into the blessedness of His Kingdom requires enduring the suffering that is a natural consequence of dying to the power of sin in our lives as we place serving God and neighbor before serving ourselves. That comes to us no more easily than did the healing from the passions that Mary spent years in the desert seeking.

Remember, however, that the miserable sex addict eventually did find healing and become a glorious saint. She did so not by fooling herself into thinking that she simply needed to accept and act on her inclinations in order to be true to herself. Neither did she try to hide them behind a false layer of religious respectability. Instead, she had the courage to entrust herself fully to the ministry of the "High Priest of the good things to come...[Who] through His own blood, entered in once for all into the holy place, having found eternal redemption." It should be no surprise that those who entrust themselves to Him must pursue the difficult path of repentance that leads to the Cross.

There is simply no other way to serve the Lord Who said, "the Son of man will be delivered to the chief priests and the scribes, and they will condemn Him to death, and deliver Him to the Gentiles. And they will mock Him, and scourge Him, and spit upon Him, and kill Him; and after three days He will rise." There was hope even for St. Mary of Egypt in Him, even as there is for each of us. Like her, we must refuse to be defined by our passions and by whatever wounds we have suffered. Like her, we must take up the cross of doing whatever it takes to find healing for our souls in the Lord Who offered up Himself for the salvation of the world. 

The Triodion period in the Orthodox Christian Church, which includes the four pre-Lenten Sundays, Great Lent, and Holy Week, provides for the faithful an excellent annual psychosomatic preparation for the Feast of Feasts: Pascha, our Lord's glorious and life-giving Resurrection. God becomes Man, taking on our FULL human nature in order to fully save us. It stands therefore to reason that for us to "psychically" or "soulfully" experience (for psychi means "soul" in Greek) the Resurrection, we must also physically or bodily prepare for it. Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are key elements of this annual Lenten preparation. At their core is repentance, a change of heart or attitude, a reorientation of our life.

What better example of repentance could we have than St. Mary of Egypt (sixth century), who is commemorated on the fifth Sunday of Great Lent. A woman of ill-repute who, after spending 17 years as a harlot, at the Feast of the Holy Cross in Jerusalem was invisibly unable to enter the church. This barrier opened her heart to the reality of her sinful life, which in turn opened her to the

sweet love of our Lord through His Mother Mary. The Theotokos led her to the wilderness across the Jordan River where she spent the next 47 years in prayer and ascetic discipline. This extraordinary change, from one extreme to another, may be difficult for us to imagine. However, it provides hope that the love of God, with a willingness from us, can overcome all obstacles.

After serving on our local IOCC Metropolitan Committee for 25 years, I am so grateful for the loving, caring, compassionate, and dedicated work of IOCC. I refer to the organization with Godly pride in our pan-Orthodox reality internationally, nationally, and locally. I refer to the staff and volunteers with personal gratefulness at those levels as well. And finally, I refer to the thousands or tens of thousands that have been assisted or touched by the philanthropic and philoxenic love of IOCC, without whom we would be nothing. Hope that the love of God, with willingness from us, can overcome all obstacles.




