WE WELCOME YOU TODAY

We would like to remind our visitors of the following;:

- All people are encouraged to participate in the sacred services of our Church. We hope that you will be able to worship as well as have fellowship with us. Should you wish any information about the Orthodox Faith or this parish in particular, please see the rector or any member of the church. We are able to place you on our mailing list.
- Only Orthodox Christians may receive the Eucharist (Holy Communion) in the Orthodox Church. In like manner, Orthodox Christians may not receive the sacraments in an non-Orthodox Church. While we hope that one day all Christians will find unity and be able to approach the chalice of our Lord together, we observe the teachings of the Church that the Eucharist is a gift of unity and not a means of unity.

We remind our faithful and visitors of the following guidelines concerning the Holy Sacraments in the Orthodox Church.

- Orthodox Christians are urged to receive Holy Communion frequently.
- ❖ Communicants should be at peace with others before approaching the chalice(Mt 5:23-24)
- Realize the importance of making a thorough examination of sins and transgressions against God, ourselves and others and having prayed for forgiveness before coming to Holy Communion.
- Frequent communicants should come to Holy Confession at least four times a year (during the four fasting periods of the year). and additionally when an examination of conscience reveals the necessity to do so in order to heal any sinful behavior.
- Communicants should fast from all foods and liquids from the evening before receiving Holy Communion.
- Communicants should read prayers in preparation for receiving Holy Communion.
- ❖ All Orthodox Christians must receive the sacraments at least once a year.
- Those who are late for Divine Liturgy (after the reading of the Epistle and Gospel) should not approach the chalice.
- Those who are ill or who have special physical needs are exempt from the above guidelines.
- Infants and children (up to the age of seven) who are Orthodox Christians may receive Holy Communion and are exempt from the above guidelines.

Thank you for gathering to worship with us today. Together we have glorified the One God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. May we be brought closer to one another and closer to God by following the eternal teachings of our Lord.

Lesson from the First Epistle of St. Paul to the Corinthians (c.9, v. 2-12)

Brethren, you yourselves are the certificate of my apostleship in the service of the Lord. Now, my defense to those, who call me to account, is the following:

We have the right to be provided with food and drink for our services. We have the right to travel with our Christian wives like the other Apostles, like the Lord's brethren, and like Peter.

Barnabas and myself must not be the only ones, who have to labor for self-support. No soldier serves at his own expense. No one tends a flock without drinking any of its milk. This is not a plea, invented by man. The Scripture tells us so also. For in the Law of Moses it is written: "You must not muzzle an ox, that thrashes the corn." Of course, God was not making provisions for oxen, but altogether for our sake.

Yes, this rule was written for our sake. Because the ploughman has a right to plough, and the thrasher to thrash, with the expectation of sharing the crop. So, it is not such a great matter to reap from you a temporal reward for the spiritual harvest we have sown among you.

If others enjoy such a right over you, we certainly have a still better claim. Nevertheless, we have never availed ourselves of this legitimate right. On the contrary, we endure every privation rather than put an obstacle in the way of the Gospel of Christ.

The Gospel According to St. Matthew

(c. 18, v.23-35)

The Lord narrated this parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a king who wanted to settle accounts with his servants. When he had begun the reckoning, a man was brought in who owed him ten thousand talents. As he could not pay, his master ordered that he should be sold with his wife, his children, and all his property in payment of the debt. Then the servant knelt before him, and implored him: 'Master, give me time, and I will pay you in full.' His master, moved with pity for him, released him and cancelled the debt.

But when that servant went out, he met one of his fellow-servants who owed him one hundred shillings, caught him by the throat, and told him: 'Pay me your debt.' His fellow-servant knelt before him, and implored him: 'Give me time, and I will pay you.' He refused, but went and threw him into prison until he should pay the debt."

"When his

fellow-servants saw what had happened, they were deeply grieved. So they went to their master, and reported the whole matter to him. Then his master sent for him, and told him: 'You wicked servant! I cancelled all that debt when you entreated me. Then it was your duty to have mercy on your fellow-servant as I had mercy on you.' So in anger his master handed him over to the jailers to be tortured until he should pay all his debt So also my heavenly Father will do to everyone of you, if you do not forgive the trespasses of your brother with all your heart."

Sponsor-A-Day Program Update

At the annual parish meeting held in October 2023 the parish voted to approve the Finance Committee's recommendation to implement a Sponsorship program to raise money for the church's General Fund. The General Fund is used to pay the day-to-day operating expenses of the church and church properties (Ex: utilities, insurance, salaries, etc.).

Our 10/2022-9/2023 General Fund expenses were approximately \$150,000 (10/21-9/22 was more, at approximately \$162,500) and our 2024 member obligations are \$725 per member. With about 100 members (our current membership), member obligations will cover about \$72,500 of expenses (less than half of our expected annual expenses). Historically, the gap between member obligations and expenses has been covered largely by the generous donations of our church organizations, parishioners, and friends. But, with so many (38) of our members passing away over the last 5 years, the gap is greater than ever.

The Sponsor-A-Day program is a way to contribute to the church's financial well-being beyond obligations. It costs approximately \$450 per day to operate the church, hall, and rectory. If you are able and interested in sponsoring a day of operating expenses (or a half day or any portion of a day), please complete the form on the back of the bulletin and provide it, along with your donation, to Treasurer Brittany Brettell.

 - o Responsibilities include: reserving a location for the annual Church School Picnic (e.g. Scott Park or Carnegie Park); recruiting volunteers for setup/running/clean up of event, coordinating food, purchasing supplies.
- Church School Substitute Teacher
 - o Responsibilities include: being on call to substitute for regular teacher in case of absence.

Saints Adrian and Natalia of Nicomedia and the 23 Martyrs With Them

Saints Adrian and his wife Natalia hailed from Nicomedia. During the second reign of Maximian (306-308), there were twenty-three Christians that he found in a cave and inflicted upon them diverse tortures. Adrian, who was twenty-eight years old and head of the praetorium, learned of this and inquired of them why they endured such torments. They answered him, saying, "We endure them so that we might gain those good things prepared by God in the heavens for those who suffer for His love; indeed, such things which no ear can possibly hear nor word can set before the mind." This response moved blessed Adrian to compunction, and he was filled with divine grace, igniting a flame within him to also undergo torment for the love of Christ.

Thus Adrian turned to the recorders who were preparing the lists of those Christians to be slain, and uttered, "Write my name together with the names of the others, for I too count it pleasure to die with them for the love of Christ." Whereupon, they entered his name in the lists, and had him bound with chains and locked in prison.

Having left the prison, Natalia returned home. Adrian, however, bribed the guards to release him for an appointed time to notify his wife that he would soon be martyred. When Adrian arrived at his home, Natalia assumed Adrian feared the torments and denied Christ, and reproved him for being a coward and lamented for the missed



opportunity of being the wife of a martyr. But when she was informed of the true reason for Adrian's return, she was exceedingly glad and embraced him. They therefore returned to the prison together, where Natalia tended to the wounds of the Christians prisoners. When the emperor learned this, he forbade Natalia and the other women from coming to the prison to attend to the Christians. Undaunted, Natalia cropped her hair and, donning male clothes, she bribed her way into the jail.

When Adrian stood before the emperor, he boldly confessed Christ, for which he was thrashed with staves, then thrown on the ground and beaten upon his thorax and abdomen till his entrails were exposed. Afterwards, they cut off his hands and feet together with the other Christians. Indeed, Natalia was not only present at the severing, but assisted in the dismemberment by placing each member upon the anvil for cutting. She would even beseech the executioner to bring down the cleaver and hammer with a mightier blow, to render greater and harsher pain for the Saint; for she believed his reward would be greater. At the same time she emboldened Adrian and endowed him with strength to endure the pains courageously, so as not to betray Christ during his martyrdom.

During the course of these torments, Adrian and Christ's twenty-three other athletes finished the course of martyrdom. The idolaters were about to cast their sacred bodies into the fire, when the blessed Natalia retrieved one of Adrian's hands. She hid it under her shirt, and attended to see the outcome of the sacred relics. And when she noticed the blood dripping from them, she anointed herself with it as if it was myrrh and spices.

As the holy relics were cast into the flames, a sudden storm of rain fell and quenched the fire. Whereupon, a certain Christian named Eusebius gathered up the sacred relics and brought them on board a boat. He brought them to Argyropolis, near Constantinople, where he interred them, and later on a church was built there in their honor.

The names of the twenty-three athletes of Christ are as follows: Anatolios, Anthimos, Antiochus, Gentelios, Eleutherios, Hermogenes, Evethios, Euretos, Eutychios, Theagones, Theodore, Thyrsos, John, Karteras, Claudius, Kyriakos, Marinos, Mardonius, Menodius, Platon, Synetos, Troadios and Pharetrios.

Shortly thereafter, Natalia was pursued by a certain imperial officer at Nicomedia who desired to take this young and wealthy widow as his wife. This caused Natalia to flee by ship to the location of her husbands sacred relics with his companions. Soon after she surrendered her soul into the hands of God, and was buried with the Holy Martyrs.

Although Natalia did not shed her blood and suffer physical martyrdom, she is still numbered with the Martyrs for having cosuffered with them by ministering to them and encouraging them. As our Savior promised: "He that receives a righteous man in the name of a righteous man shall receive a righteous man's reward" (Matt. 10:42).

Aluminum/Metals Recycling

With so many new faces and members in our Church, I need to formally inform everyone about a fundraising idea I implemented more than ten years ago. This idea involves everyone in our Church doing what you are already doing for your township or borough. That is, collecting aluminum cans, baking pans and foil and bringing them to our Church to give to me, Mike Sally, the tall, goofy guy who sings bass in the choir!

I take all of these metal items to a scrapyard on Neville Island and get cash to donate to our Church! I do <u>not</u> charge a fee for taking these metals so as to make sure our Church gets as much money as possible. I prefer collecting aluminum because it has a much lighter weight than other metals but can currently get us 5 times more money than tin cans, which are heavier. Aluminum is also made into gutters, downspouts, flashing, screen doors and some door trim. Basically, it is a lightweight metal that does **not** stick to a magnet.

Though, I also encourage you to bring other types of metals, especially brass and copper, which are worth more than aluminum but may be overlooked because of their lesser quantities. Copper can be found in pipes and electrical wiring and Brass is made into pipe fittings and connectors and other small items. Both copper and brass are also **not** attracted to a magnet. Larger items like appliances and lawnmowers can be picked up directly from your home if you talk to me on a Sunday at coffee hour. Aluminum soda/beer cans and cat food cans **can** be crushed, but **PLEASE DO NOT** add anything inside these crushed cans to add extra weight!! I have a very good relationship with the owners of the scrapyard and I don't want to damage that relationship. Also, please rinse out all cans with water to prevent bugs, bees and hornets from being attracted to them.

When hosting coffee hour, please keep in mind that there are three recyclables bins behind the door to the kitchen where you can put your rinsed aluminum pans and foil after cleaning up. With just a little bit of effort we can all turn our garbage into free money for our Church!! Thank you!

I am currently trying to find a large, plastic bin with a hinged lid to place between the Church and the hall where anyone can put small bags of cans or other small quantities of metals into so as not to create a messy collections area. If anyone can donate this type of bin or towards the purchase of one, please talk to me.

FOOD FESTIVAL BASKET RAFFLE


