WE WELCOME YOU TODAY

We would like to remind our visitors of the following;:

- All people are encouraged to participate in the sacred services of our Church. We hope that you will be able to worship as well as have fellowship with us. Should you wish any information about the Orthodox Faith or this parish in particular, please see the rector or any member of the church. We are able to place you on our mailing list.
- Only Orthodox Christians may receive the Eucharist (Holy Communion) in the Orthodox Church. In like manner, Orthodox Christians may not receive the sacraments in an non-Orthodox Church. While we hope that one day all Christians will find unity and be able to approach the chalice of our Lord together, we observe the teachings of the Church that the Eucharist is a gift of unity and not a means of unity.

We remind our faithful and visitors of the following guidelines concerning the Holy Sacraments in the Orthodox Church.

- Orthodox Christians are urged to receive Holy Communion frequently.
- ❖ Communicants should be at peace with others before approaching the chalice(Mt 5:23-24)
- Realize the importance of making a thorough examination of sins and transgressions against God, ourselves and others and having prayed for forgiveness before coming to Holy Communion.
- Frequent communicants should come to Holy Confession at least four times a year (during the four fasting periods of the year). and additionally when an examination of conscience reveals the necessity to do so in order to heal any sinful behavior.
- Communicants should fast from all foods and liquids from the evening before receiving Holy Communion.
- Communicants should read prayers in preparation for receiving Holy Communion.
- ❖ All Orthodox Christians must receive the sacraments at least once a year.
- Those who are late for Divine Liturgy (after the reading of the Epistle and Gospel) should not approach the chalice.
- Those who are ill or who have special physical needs are exempt from the above guidelines.
- Infants and children (up to the age of seven) who are Orthodox Christians may receive Holy Communion and are exempt from the above guidelines.

Thank you for gathering to worship with us today. Together we have glorified the One God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. May we be brought closer to one another and closer to God by following the eternal teachings of our Lord.

тим, хто часто причащається, слід приходити на святу сповідь принаймні чотири рази на рік (під час кожного із чотирьох щорічних постів);



Troparion to St Euphemia-Tone 3

You brought joy to the Orthodox and shame to the defenders of heresy, for you confirmed what the Fathers of the Fourth Council had correctly taught.

Glorious martyr Euphemia, fair virgin of Christ, entreat Christ God to grant us His great mercy.

Kontakion to St Euphemia-Tone 2

For the sake of Christ your Bridegroom you underwent struggles struggles in both martyrdom and faith. Now intercede with the Mother of God that heresies and the insolent enemies of the Orthodox be placed underfoot. You received and guarded that which was defined by the six hundred and thirty God-bearing Fathers, all-praised Euphemia.

Kontakion to the Resurrection - Tone 5

Thou didst descend into hell, O my Savior, shattering its gates as Almighty; resurrecting the dead as Creator, and destroying the sting of death. Thou hast delivered Adam from the curse, O Lover of Man, and we cry to Thee, O Lord, save us!

Thou, O Lord, will protect us; and will keep us from this generation forever. Verse: Save me, O Lord, for there is not one godly man left.

Lesson from the Second Epistle of Saint Paul to the Corinthians (c. 1, v. 21-24; c. 2, v. 1-4)

Brethren, God himself has confirmed me with you in Christ. He has anointed me, he has put his seal on me, he has given me the pledge of the Holy Spirit in my heart.

Upon my soul I call God to witness that I quit coming to Corinth, because I wanted to spare you, not because I domineer over your faith. Rather I am helping you to achieve happiness, for you are standing firm in your faith.

I made up my mind not to pay another painful visit. For if I cause you pain, then no one will be left to make me glad. I wrote you, as I did, so that, when I come, I should not be pained by those, who should make me rejoice.

I felt sure that my joy would be the joy of you all. For I wrote you with much affliction, with anguish of heart, and with many tears, not to cause you pain, but to show you the abundant love I feel for you.

The Gospel According to St. Matthew (c.22, v.2-14)

The Lord narrated this parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a king who gave a wedding banquet for his son. So he sent his servants to summon those who had been invited to the banquet. But they refused to come.

Again he sent other servants and said to them: 'Tell those who have been invited: 'Behold, I have prepared my banquet, my bullocks and my fat calves are slaughtered and everything is ready. Come to the wedding festival.' But they ignored him, and went off, one to his estate, another to his business, while the others seized his servants, insulted them and killed them."

"When the king heard this news, he was enraged, sent his troops, put those murderers to death, and burned their city. Then he said to his servants: The banquet is ready, but those who were invited proved unworthy of it. So go out to the thoroughfares and invite to the banquet everyone you find. The servants went out to the streets, and gathered all the people they could find, good or bad, so the hall was filled with guests."

"But when the king went in to look at the guests, he observed a man who was not wearing a wedding-garment and said to him: 'My friend, how did you come in here without a wedding-garment?' He made no reply. Then the king said to his attendants: 'Bind him hand and foot, and throw him to the outer darkness, where sinners are wailing and gnashing their teeth.' For many are called, but few are chosen."

Sponsor-A-Day Program Update

At the annual parish meeting held in October 2023 the parish voted to approve the Finance Committee's recommendation to implement a Sponsorship program to raise money for the church's General Fund. The General Fund is used to pay the day-to-day operating expenses of the church and church properties (Ex: utilities, insurance, salaries, etc.).

Our 10/2022-9/2023 General Fund expenses were approximately \$150,000 (10/21-9/22 was more, at approximately \$162,500) and our 2024 member obligations are \$725 per member. With about 100 members (our current membership), member obligations will cover about \$72,500 of expenses (less than half of our expected annual expenses). Historically, the gap between member obligations and expenses has been covered largely by the generous donations of our church organizations, parishioners, and friends. But, with so many (38) of our members passing away over the last 5 years, the gap is greater than ever.

The Sponsor-A-Day program is a way to contribute to the church's financial well-being beyond obligations. It costs approximately \$450 per day to operate the church, hall, and rectory. If you are able and interested in sponsoring a day of operating expenses (or a half day or any portion of a day), please complete the form on the back of the bulletin and provide it, along with your donation, to Treasurer Brittany Brettell.

Please note that this program is intended to be a <u>supplement</u> to member obligations. So, we only encourage participation if you are able to donate beyond your 2024 member obligations. Thank you for your support! Parish Council

Great Martyr Euphemia the All-Praised

The Miracle of Saint Euphemia the All-Praised: The holy Great Martyr Euphemia (September 16) suffered martyrdom in the city of Chalcedon in the year 304, during the time of the persecution against Christians by the emperor Diocletian (284-305). One and a half centuries later, at a time when the Christian Church had become victorious within the Roman Empire, God deigned that Euphemia the All-Praised should again be a witness and confessor of the purity of the Orthodox teaching.

In the year 451 in the city of Chalcedon, in the very church where the glorified relics of the holy Great Martyr Euphemia rested, the sessions of the Fourth Ecumenical Council (July 16) took place. The Council was convened for determining the precise



dogmatic formulae of the Orthodox Church concerning the nature of the God-Man Jesus Christ. This was necessary because of the widespread heresy of the Monophysites ["mono-physis" meaning "one nature"], who opposed the Orthodox teaching of the two natures in Jesus Christ, the Divine and the Human natures (in one Divine Person). The Monophysites falsely affirmed that in Christ was only one nature, the Divine [i.e. that Jesus is God but not man, by nature], causing discord and unrest within the Church. At the Council were present 630 representatives from all the local Christian Churches. On the Orthodox side Anatolius, Patriarch of Constantinople (July 3), Juvenal, Patriarch of Jerusalem (July 2), and representatives of Saint Leo, Pope of Rome (February 18) participated in the conciliar deliberations. The Monophysites were present in large numbers, headed by Dioscorus, the Patriarch of Alexandria, and the Constantinople archimandrite Eutychius.

After prolonged discussions the two sides could not come to a decisive agreement.

The holy Patriarch Anatolius of Constantinople proposed that the Council submit the decision of the Church dispute to the Holy Spirit, through His undoubted bearer Saint Euphemia the All-Praised, whose wonderworking relics had been discovered during the Council's discussions. The Orthodox hierarchs and their opponents wrote down their confessions of faith on separate scrolls and sealed them with their seals. They opened the tomb of the holy Great Martyr Euphemia and placed both scrolls upon her bosom. Then, in the presence of the emperor Marcian (450-457), the participants of the Council sealed the tomb, putting on it the imperial seal and setting a guard to watch over it for three days. During these days both sides imposed upon themselves strict fast and made intense prayer. After three days the patriarch and the emperor in the presence of the Council opened the tomb with its relics: the scroll with the Orthodox confession was held by Saint Euphemia in her right hand, and the scroll of the heretics lay at her feet. Saint Euphemia, as though alive, raised her hand and gave the scroll to the patriarch. After this miracle many of the hesitant accepted the Orthodox confession, while those remaining obstinant in the heresy were consigned to the Council's condemnation and excommunication.

After an invasion by the Persians during the seventh century, the relics of Saint Euphemia were transferred from Chalcedon to Constantinople, into a newly built church dedicated to her. Many years later, during the period of the Iconoclast heresy, the reliquary with the relics of the saint was cast into the sea by order of the Iconoclast emperor Leo the Isaurian (716-741). The reliquary was rescued from the sea by the ship-owning brothers Sergius and Sergonos, who gave it over to the local bishop. The holy bishop ordered that the relics be preserved in secret, beneath a crypt, since the Iconoclast heresy was continuing to rage. A small church was built over the relics, and over the reliquary was put a board with an inscription stating whose relics rested within. When the Iconoclast heresy was finally condemned at the holy Seventh Ecumenical Council (in the year 787), during the time of Saint Tarasius, Patriarch of Constantinople (784-806) and the emperor Constantine VI (780-797) and his mother Saint Irene (797-802), the relics of the holy Great Martyr Euphemia were once again solemnly transferred to Constantinople.

Ukraine is in the forefront of the use of art therapy on a massive scale. Tetiana is the founder and director of the Ukrainian non-profit citizens' organization "Pyaternya," which runs the Warm Hands art therapy and skills development. The visit is funded by a private donor and not using funds donated to UCHI to help the children by the general public. It is a gesture of gratitude to the American people for the over \$250,000 in privately funded aid that UCHI has leveraged — every penny of which goes to assisting the children with full transparency showing gainful use of all funds provided.

Tetiana will explain how the war has affected the lives of orphans and other children displaced by the unprecedented, unprovoked invasion, and also for the widows of the war and the soldiers who fight valiantly for their country's freedom and protection of loved ones from the onslaught of a nation that calls itself a brother. She will demonstrate how the arts assist in healing and are intimately involved in the resistance against this attempted annihilation of the Ukrainian culture.
