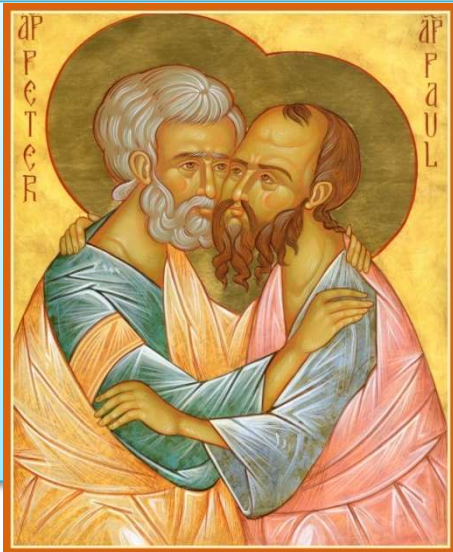

WE WELCOME YOU TODAY

We would like to remind our visitors of the following;:

- ❖ All people are encouraged to participate in the sacred services of our Church. We hope that you will be able to worship as well as have fellowship with us. Should you wish any information about the Orthodox Faith or this parish in particular, please see the rector or any member of the church. We are able to place you on our mailing list.
- ❖ Only Orthodox Christians may receive the Eucharist (Holy Communion) in the Orthodox Church. In like manner, Orthodox Christians may not receive the sacraments in a non-Orthodox Church. While we hope that one day all Christians will find unity and be able to approach the chalice of our Lord together, we observe the teachings of the Church that the Eucharist is a gift of unity and not a means of unity.

We remind our faithful and visitors of the following guidelines concerning the Holy Sacraments in the Orthodox Church.

- ❖ Orthodox Christians are urged to receive Holy Communion frequently.
- ❖ Communicants should be at peace with others before approaching the chalice (Mt 5:23-24)
- ❖ Realize the importance of making a thorough examination of sins and transgressions against God, ourselves and others and having prayed for forgiveness before coming to Holy Communion.
- ❖ Frequent communicants should come to Holy Confession at least four times a year (during the four fasting periods of the year) and additionally when an examination of conscience reveals the necessity to do so in order to heal any sinful behavior.
- ❖ Communicants should fast from all foods and liquids from the evening before receiving Holy Communion.
- ❖ Communicants should read prayers in preparation for receiving Holy Communion.
- ❖ All Orthodox Christians must receive the sacraments at least once a year.
- ❖ Those who are late for Divine Liturgy (after the reading of the Epistle and Gospel) should not approach the chalice.
- ❖ Those who are ill or who have special physical needs are exempt from the above guidelines.
- ❖ Infants and children (up to the age of seven) who are Orthodox Christians may receive Holy Communion and are exempt from the above guidelines.

Thank you for gathering to worship with us today. Together we have glorified the One God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. May we be brought closer to one another and closer to God by following the eternal teachings of our Lord.

ті, хто причащаються, повинні бути у мирі з іншими перш, нас підійти до євхаристичної чаші (Св.Матвії 5:23-24);

перед тим, як прийти на Святе Причастя, дуже важливо ретельно осмислити гріхи і порушення, які було вчинено проти Бога, нас самих та інших і помолитися за їх відпущення;

тим, хто часто причащається, слід приходити на святу сповідь принаймні чотири рази на рік (під час кожного із чотирьох щорічних постів);

ті, хто причащається, повинні з вечора перед прийняттям Святого Причастя, припинити вживання всякої їжі і напоїв;

ті, хто причащається, повинні шляхом молитов підготувати себе до прийняття причастя;

всі православні християни повинні, принаймні, раз на рік отримати Святе Причастя;

Lesson from the Epistle of Saint Paul to the Romans

(c. 13, v. 11-14; c. 14, v. 1-4)

Brethren, our salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed in the Gospel. The night is nearly over, and the day is approaching. Therefore, let us abandon all the practices of benighted paganism and let us take up the weapons of enlightened Christianity.

Let us live decently as in the full light of the day. Turn away from revelry, drunkenness, lewdness, licentiousness, dissension, and rivalry. Put on the armor of our Lord Jesus Christ, and forget all about gratifying the passions of the flesh.

Welcome the man, who is weak in faith without arguing about his scruples. Some men believe in eating everything. Others, who are scrupulous, eat only vegetarian food.

The man, who eats meat, must not look down on the man, who abstains from it. Likewise, the man, who abstains from meat, must not criticize the man, who eats it. For God has welcomed him. Who are you to pass judgment on the servant of another? Whether he stands or falls, concerns only his master. To be sure, he will stand on his feet. For God is able to make him stand.

SCRIPTURE STUDY - Changes! Due to the serving of Andrew of Crete on Monday the 3rd of March the next Monday evening Scripture Class will move to Monday the 10th of March. That class will begin a discussion of the book of Isaiah which part of our Lenten readings. The Monday evening class meet via Zoom at 7 O'clock. The Thursday morning class will meet next on Thursday the 6th of March. That class will have a discussion of the ways that the church prepares us for Lent. The Thursday morning class meets in person at 11:30 in the church hall.

Second phase of the hall HVAC project The Parish council would like to thank everyone that donated to the upper hall heating and air conditioning project this past fall. We literally had no heat in the upper hall and never did have air conditioning. In order to get heat and air conditioning in the upper hall we had to make room in the hall's electric breaker box for the new outside units. We disconnected all of the window unit air conditioners in the downstairs hall as they were getting older and not very efficient. The window units in the meeting area and kitchen will remain connected. The new outdoor hall units were sized in the first phase of the project to heat and air condition the upper hall and also the lower hall. So now it is time to restore air conditioning to the downstairs hall. Nothing needs to be done to the outdoor units but four more interior wall units need to be added to the downstairs hall. They will look exactly like the upstairs units. The third and final phase of the hall HVAC upgrade will be to remove all of the old window units and new block windows will need to be placed in the space of the old air conditioning units. We are asking for donations for these downstairs air conditioning units in phase 2 of the project now in order to get the project moving and have air conditioning in place for the spring humid weather. WAR RELIEF PURCHASE: The parish council at the last monthly meeting passed a motion to send funds for five sets of encrypted walkie talkies to be sent to the 72nd Brigade on the front lines in Ukraine. Each set of walkie talkies cost \$707.00 The Parish Council will send \$3,535.00 from the War Relief fund for this purchase. PITTSBURGH HISTORY & LANDMARKS FOUNDATION: Our church recently submitted a grant application for repairs to our church building to the Pittsburgh History and Landmarks Foundation. The foundation provides grants to historical landmarks in order to improve their buildings that may be in need of repairs. The Parish Council would like to thank Mrs. Mary Stevens who initiated the grant application back in late 2023 and early 2024. Mary saw an opportunity to obtain monies from a respected foundation in order to improve our church home without the church needing to increase obligations. Mary continued to organize and push for the submittal of the grant application throughout the 2023 and 2024 years. Parish Council would also like to thank Mrs. Katherine Mansfield who worked with Mary and gathered all of the information required, filled out the grant application and sent in all of the paperwork. This was a very time consuming effort on Katherines part. The application was finally submitted by the required deadline. We heard back from them this past week and we were awarded a grant for \$9,500.00 for repairs to our church roof. We will need to raise about \$9,500.00 in order to get the full effect of the matching grant. This project will be able to start immediately when the weather breaks. We will be getting bids for the work in the near future. Some of the work to be completed includes painting of the concrete parapet on top of the roof and finishing up the sealing between the shingles and parapet roof line. If you see these magnificent ladies, please thank them for their tireless efforts and their love and dedication to keep our church home beautiful and in proper operating condition without very little impact to our finances.
